# MESSAGE FROM OUR PCSO

The summer months seem to have been and gone far to quickly for my liking, even though the weather wasn't particularly brilliant in parts! Saying that I hope you've had a good time watching the Olympics and had the opportunity for a BBQ or two! Now we are coming to the winter months and nights are drawing in, a number of different policing issues can present themselves however its best I first give you an update on the issues since my last report.

In terms of crime reported since June when I last wrote, we have had five burglaries of residential properties, four burglaries of out buildings and commercial premises, eleven thefts from vehicle and three thefts of vehicle. For anti social/rowdy behaviour we have had 25 calls reported which is down on figures on previous years. A number of our anti social related calls have been to the old Hill View Farm, Lambourne Close where youths have been gaining access to the site and setting fires etc. The owner of the site Taylor Wimpey has now fenced off the grounds which has helped to provide a deterrent to youths attempting to gain access. In terms of ASB at the Big Meadow, again call numbers seemed to have dropped which is partly thanks to the continued policing operation between Warwickshire and West Mercia police to conduct regular checks on the site.

As many of you are aware, during the beginning of August there was an increase in vehicle crime particularly thefts from vehicles and thefts of vehicles from around the village. It was believed that from the description given of the offender that this was the work of one particular individual, who was already wanted by Police. Thankfully after a joint operation with our neighbouring forces in disseminating intelligence this male was located and arrested by Gloucestershire Police within Cheltenham.

On a more positive note a Community Speed Watch course for residents from Bidford and Welford has recently been run, with hope that the volunteers will be out conducting speed checks within the community fairly soon. If anyone is interested in joining the speed watch scheme then please feel free to contact me on the below details.

A little bit of crime prevention for you all

out there! There has been increasing report recently, of thefts of catalytic convertors from vehicles, in particular from 4x4's. This is due to the ease of going under the vehicle to unbolt the cat-convertor thanks to the vehicles higher ground clearance. Therefore I would advise you if possible to store your vehicle securely within a garage and should this not be possible to park your vehicle on a driveway with the rear of your vehicle difficult to access, failing that making sure it is parked in a well lit area. Should you see anyone acting suspiciously round vehicles then please phone the police straight away.

At the time of writing this I'd like to point out that the Alcester South community forum is due on 11th September at St. Benedicts School, Kinwarton Road, Alcester from 6.30pm onwards where you are able to attend and voice your concerns about your community and where our three policing priorities are set for the next three months. I've also started to conduct police surgeries in our mobile police station van in Bidford, Welford and Salford Priors with the next one being 19th September from 9.30-10.00am on Bidford High Street this again on 29th September at 15.30-16.00 on the High Street, coincidentally the same date of the open afternoon of Bidford Youth Club (12-5pm at Salford Road Bidford) Please feel free to pop along and say hello.

Finally I'd like to wish all younger residents best wishes whether you're starting or returning to school! Hopefully the next few months will be both quiet and interesting ones around the village.

# WARWICKSHIRE COMMUNITY OIL SYNDICATE

Warwickshire Rural Community Council (WRCC) is delighted to announce the launch of Warwickshire Community Oil Syndicate, a new venture that will be good for individuals, rural communities and the environment. The Warwickshire Community Oil Syndicate will use the model of a local buying syndicate for domestic heating oil but will roll it out across the whole county.

There is great strength in harnessing the purchasing power of the many rural communities who are without mains gas and oil-buyers will be able to make significant savings. The oil syndicate brings together orders from householders, community organisations and businesses across the county which are then added to other counties who operate similar buying groups to get the very best price, with an average saving per

order of more than £350. Chief Executive, Kim Slater, says "The key to making this work will be having local people who will collate the local oil orders once a month and pass the information to us; and who will then let the local members know the cost per litre and the delivery date. That's pretty much it. For undertaking this voluntary role they will get free membership of the oil syndicate an annual saving of £320. Members of the

Warwickshire Community Oil Syndicate will be able to order as many times as they like during the year and the price will be negotiated centrally." # A NEW FACE FOR BIDFORD SCAN

As from this month, SCAN is changing its working structure, taking it out of the VASA and local authority framework, and planting its roots firmly in Bidford. In common with the other Older Peoples' Action Groups in Stratford district, SCAN in Bidford is to be run and managed in its own village, with greater freedom to raise and manage its money and activities through a newly-formed management committee, and a separate bank account held and controlled by SCAN members.

Ever since the Older People's Groups were set up in this district some ten years ago, they have been funded and co-ordinated by Stratford District and Warwickshire County Councils. Created through the Government's "Better Services for Older People" initiative, they were made a responsibility of the County, with management support provided at the local level initially by Chris Mitchell and latterly by Jan Roberts of Stratford District Council. Finance was provided by the County itself.

2010 saw major changes taking place. The annual funding of £1500 per year was cut to £750, and this year (April 2012 - March 2013) it has been withdrawn altogether. Fortunately, Stratford District stepped in, and agreed to a grant to cover the immediate shortfall, but only for one year. SCAN has now been running for three years on a reduced budget of £750, and faces a future using its own funds.

Members in Bidford, and in the neighbouring areas of Alcester, Stratford, Henley in

Arden, Shipston and Southam are picking up the challenge. Bidford has been shrewdly managed, and has some reserves, which are to be transferred this month to a new bank account in the village. A Management Team will be set up to handle the bank account and activities annually. Stratford District Council will continue to provide operational support through Jan Roberts and her team, who will retain their links with all six SCAN groups. All being well, Bidford SCAN as a voluntary organisation will affiliate to VASA, and will play its part in voluntary activity in the district.

The future is a challenge, and Bidford SCAN is taking steps to meet it. The members have agreed to affiliate to Age UK, providing an information and network facility, not to mention a £250 start-up grant, which will be very useful in the short term. Total resources, including potential income, are adequate to keep the Group going for the next three years, and the rest is up to us!

# BRAVE THE WEATHER TO SAVE A LIFE THIS AUTUMN

With the weather getting colder and the days getting shorter, many people will be spending more time at home this season following a summer of sport and Jubilee celebrations.

NHS Blood and Transplant (NHSBT) is urging people to brave the cold and the dark to give blood this month. With an ever constant demand for blood stocks, donors in the Bidford-on-Avon area are being reminded that it only takes an hour to save a life and new donors are being urged to come along too. There are many ways that donated blood can save the lives of the sick and injured. Donated blood is used not only in accident and emergency situations but also for patients undergoing surgery and receiving treatment for cancer and blood diseases, such as leukaemia. NHSBT is continuing to supply hospitals with all the blood that they need. However, both red cells and platelets have a limited shelf-life (35 days for red cells and seven days for platelets) and stocks are usually turned over within a few days. It's vital they are replenished, to replace the blood being sent to hospitals on a



daily basis. Shailesh Mistry, Lead Donor Relations Manager for NHSBT, said: "We know that the drop in temperature, the end of summer and the beginning of a new school term has meant that many of our donors have had to change their routines. "Now that people are back to their normal schedules, we would like to remind donors and those that are thinking of donating for the first time, about the constant demand for blood and inform them that now is a great time to prepare for the upcoming winter months." Anyone aged between 17 - 65, weighing more than 50 kg (7 stone 12lbs) and in general good health could potentially start saving lives by becoming a blood donor. ## DID YOU KNOW...

- NHS Blood and Transplant (NHSBT) is a joint England and Wales Special Health Authority. Its remit includes the provision of a reliable, efficient supply of blood and associated services to the NHS in England and North Wales. It is also the organ donor organisation for the UK and is responsible for matching and allocating donated organs
- The NHS needs 7,000 voluntary donations of blood daily
- NHSBT collects approximately two million units of blood each year from 1.4 million blood donors
- Around 4% of the eligible population are active blood donors
- A unit of blood is measured as 470mls (or just under a pint)
- There are four main blood groups – O, A, B and AB. Group O is the most common and therefore the most in demand. Over 95% of the blood collected is processed into its main components – red cells, platelets and plasma. A regular supply of blood is vital – red cells last only 35 days and platelets only seven days
- Female whole blood donors can give blood every 16 weeks, while male blood donors must wait 12 weeks between donations.
