BIDFORD ON AVON PARISH COUNCIL In the County of Warwickshire



This crime summary is a look at the crimes of public interest that occurred on the Bidford, Great Alne and Long Marston policing area over the last 14 days. We do not as normal practice include crimes of shoplifting, bilking, domestic violence or fraud. Week ending 3rd November 2006





BURGLARY DWELLING

Between 1700 hours on 20th October 06 and 0850 hours on 21st October 06 unknown offender/s have gained entry to two new house plots on Waterloo Road, Bidford on Avon. Once inside they have stolen some power tools. Incident number 189 of 21st October 06 refers.

Between 1100 hours and 1500 hours on 23rd October 06 unknown offender/s approached a property in Admington, Shipston on Stour. They then gained entry, possibly through an insecure front door. Once inside they have stolen a lap top computer. Incident number 227 of 24th October 06 refers.



BURGLARY COMMERCIAL AND OTHER BUILDING

Prior to 25th October unknown offender/s approached business premises in Evesham. They have then gained entry into an unattended tanker and taken a quantity of tools. Incident number 106 of 25th October 06 refers.

Between 28th October 06 and 30th October 06 unknown offender/s approached business premises on Waterloo Road, Bidford on Avon. They have then gained entry and stolen a quantity of copper cabling.

Incident number 113 of 3^{0th} October 06 refers.





CRIMINAL DAMAGE

Prior to 19th October 06 unknown offender/s approached a motor vehicle parked on Waterloo Road, Bidford on Avon. They have then slashed all four tyres. Incident number 665 of 19th October 06 refers.

Between 21st October 06 and 23rd October 06 unknown offender/s approached a property on The Close, Lower Quinton. They then used a piece of wood to cause damage to a side fire door. No entry gained.

Incident number 180 of 24th October 06 refers.



THEFT

Between midnight on 26th October 06 and 0700 hours on 28th October 06 unknown offender/s approached a silver VW Passat parked at a hotel in Abbots Salford, Evesham. They then gained entry by unknown means. Once inside they have stolen a lap top computer.

Incident number 377 of 28th October 06 refers.

Overnight between 27th October 06 and 28th October 06 unknown offender/s approached a property on Hill View Road, Bidford on Avon. They then gained entry by forcing open the boot. Once inside they have stolen various power tools. Incident number 83 of 27th October 06 refers.

Between 1600 hours on 31st October 06 and 1100 hours on 1st November 06 unknown offender/s approached a hotel in Abbots Salford, Evesham. They have then gained entry to the office and stolen an NEC Versa M300 Notebook laptop computer. Incident number 309 of 1st November 06 refers.

Between 1830 hours and 1900 hours on 31st October 06 unknown offender/s approached a white Citroen van parked on a public house car park at Wixford, Alcester. They have then forced the lock and stolen a quantity of power tools.

Incident number 577 of 31st October 06 refers.





BE AWARE

There was a pro active operation on the run up to Halloween which involved some good partnership work with the schools and shopkeepers, advising on anti social behaviour such as egg throwing. There was a heightened visible presence of police and PCSOs during half term and on Halloween night, with some pro active visits locally to known previous offenders. This resulted in a dramatic reduction of seasonal anti social behaviour incidents across the Alcester sector, especially in Studley. Of course, there were some incidents, but nowhere near that experienced last year.

This operation has been highlighted by the management to be used as good practice for next year and other seasonal events.

We would like to express our thanks to the local shopkeepers, schools and other partners for helping to make this a success.

All to note a Public Service Desk at Headquarters is now operational. The Public Service Desk (PSD) is designed to put Police Officers back in the control room, thus enabling a better service delivery to members of the public wishing to speak to a Police Officer on any matter which does not necessarily need Police deployment. Anybody wishing to speak to the Police about any issue that does not require a Police Officer to attend can do so via this Desk. Contacting any of the Police station telephone numbers will direct you to the switchboard where you can then ask for the Public Service Desk.

We are often asked the best way to report an incident or to make contact with a Police officer. Should a member of the public witness or be affected by a crime whereby there is a threat of injury, injury or damage or theft of property and the incident is ongoing and offenders are still at the scene, they should ring 999, classed as an emergency or an immediate response incident.

Should the incident have already occurred and is not ongoing, for example waking up and find your car has been broken into, you should ring one of the normal Police station numbers and ask to report a crime or an incident. You will be put through to the force control room or the crime desk. Please ask for an 'incident number' – you should be given one. If a crime has been committed against you, you will be given a crime

reference number by the crime desk or by the officer who attends the incident. Such incidents are 'managed' and you should be given an indication of when an officer can attend.

If you wish to speak to an officer about a non-urgent matter, please use the list of contacts, which are always included in our newsletters.

Hopefully the Public Help Desk will help members of the public when they wish to speak to the Police.

Crimestoppers will then pass the information to the Police without revealing any details of the caller. You may also receive a reward.
