#### CRIME IN YOUR AREA

This section looks at the crimes of public interest that have occurred on the Alcester South Safer Neighbourhood Team policing beat, crimes such as burglary, theft, auto crime and criminal damage:



#### BURGLARY.

- Burglaries Dwellings & Burglaries Others both up a touch this month unfortunately.
- Around the 23<sup>rd</sup>/24<sup>th</sup> April 2012 a number of incidents were reported of thefts from out buildings and again, the usual items such as gardening equipment and power tools were the main targets. The worst affective area appears to be Wixford and "The Grafton's"

#### AUTOCRIME.

- Vehicle crime figures up a touch on last month unfortunately.
- All the reports of thefts from motor vehicles unfortunately relate to the victims failing to remove items of value when leaving their vehicles. Don't let that be you!!!
- We have reports of 2 vehicles being targeted at Oversely Woods on 2 consecutive Sundays as they were left unattended whilst the owners were enjoying a walk.

#### THEFT.

- Metal thefts continue to be very few and far between thankfully.
- 18 lambs were taken from a farm on Georges Elm Lane in Bidford. Around 30<sup>th</sup> March 2012 the lambs, all about 10months old were taken by offender(s) unknown. Inc 85 of 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2012.



- Figures down a touch this month.
- A rear ground floor window was smashed at Alcester library sometime between 16<sup>th</sup> & 18<sup>th</sup> April 2012. Inc 160 of 18<sup>th</sup> April 2012.



- Rowdy/nuisance jobs down slightly on last month, but down considerably compared to the same time last year.
- There were no reported incidents at The Big Meadow in Bidford on Avon; with only 5 jobs reported this month for the whole of the Bidford area.
- The main hotspot areas continue to be checked on a regular basis and youths spoken to if they are causing a nuisance.

#### ALCESTER SOUTH SAFER NEIGHBOURHOOD PRIORITIES

The top issues raised at the Community Forum held at The Crawford Hall in Bidford on Avon, Monday  $5^{th}$  March 2012 were...

- 1. Anti-Social Behaviour patrols in and around the area of the Big Meadow in Bidford on Avon. Carry out an additional 12 extra patrols paying specific attention to The Big Meadow to ensure the Meadow is a safe and enjoyable area for both locals and visitors to enjoy and not a haven for feral youths. 16/12 checks done so far.
- 2. **Burglary Patrols across the whole of the SNT area**. To carry out 12 additional patrols, mainly on lates and nights, paying special attention to more remote outbuildings. 2/12 checks done so far.
- 3. Anti-Social Behaviour patrols around The Hopkins Precinct area of Alcester. To carry out 12 additional checks at well know ASB hotspots, paying special attention to Tesco's and the Alne Bank Day Centre at the rear of the Hopkins Precinct. 21/12 checks done so far.
